Doctoral Degree Requirements (Ed.D., Ph.D., D.Th.)

The Doctoral Degree Programs offered by KEISIE emphasize administration, education, leadership, and theology. Students select their desired Degree Program for various reasons: as a basis for the successful completion of their post-graduate degree, as a basis for employment in a variety of international positions which require a broader and more eclectic education, or for cultural enrichment enabling graduates to enter work within a global situation or setting.

Within the broad-based academic Degree Programs, students are allowed to have both specific concentrations focusing on their specific area of study. Concentrations include, but are not limited to: Administration, Leadership, Educational Management, Research, and Theology.

Typically, Advanced Degree Programs offered by KEISIE serve as a base for higher level studies in post-graduate, post-doctoral, and professional programs (e.g. administration, education, international studies, leadership, etc.).

Graduating from any Degree Program offered by KEISIE does not automatically qualify students for Transfer Credit (TC) to other Institutions of Higher Education. KEISIE has no specific agreement or endorsement of any agencies internationally which guarantee TC for further academic study. Students in any Degree Program offered by KEISIE should work closely with their academic advisor or counselor to identify a list of classes from KEISIE which would qualify for acceptance to other Institutions of Higher Education.

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Candidates for any Doctoral Degree received from KEISIE must satisfy the Doctoral Degree Requirements as well as the specific minimum academic requirements as follows:

GENERAL CORE COURSES

Credits

This area includes courses on the Doctoral Education Distribution list. (Select 2) 12

CORE COURSES FOR DEGREE MAJOR

This area includes courses on the Doctoral Education Distribution list. (Select 1) 6
These courses must be taken within the student's academic discipline.

DEGREE CONCENTRATION COURSES

This area includes courses on the Doctoral Education Distribution list. (Select 2) 12
These courses must be taken within the student's academic discipline.

This area includes courses on the Master Education Distribution list. (Select 2) 12
These courses must be taken in more than one academic discipline, or any other courses with the same prefix (EDU, BUS, PSY, THEO, IT).

Credit courses must be chosen from those which are listed in the Master Handbook.

TOTAL CREDITS 60

The total number of credits required for the doctoral degree programs are equally distributed between Core Courses, Concentration Courses, and Elective Courses (Students are also required to complete a Doctoral Research Project). Students selecting their major, concentration and/or minor should discuss their degree program plans with an academic advisor or counselor before they reach the midway point through their Core Courses. The total number of online classes need to complete the degree program is 7. Because of the accelerated nature of study, students are prohibited from enrolling in more than one course per academic session, except in cases where permission is given by the Institution.
